



Kutstone Planter & Amenities Care Instructions

- 1) Unpack your planters carefully. If using a knife or other sharp object, cut packaging carefully to avoid damaging the surface of the planters.
- 2) If you want a hole for drainage, you may drill a hole with a standard drill motor. We recommend a minimum size of at least 3/8", the larger the hole the more freely it will drain. It is easier to drill from the inside bottom of the planter (your bit will stay sharper this way).
- 3) If you are in a freezing climate, you **MUST** drill a drain hole if the planter is to be used outdoors. All standing water must freely drain in the winter. Cracks from ice expansion are not covered under warranty.
- 4) If your area is subject to "ICE DAMMING", we recommend you fill the void under the inside rim with expansion foam designed for outdoor use. Be careful not to get the foam on exposed stone surfaces as it is very difficult to remove.
- 5) If you area is prone to heavy snow loads, we recommend you do not allow heavy snow accumulation to build up on some of the planters. The cubic planters are a little more fragile than others.
- 6) Cleaning: You may use a mild cleanser to clean the stone surface. Do not scrape surface, but use a soft sponge with a mild cleaner such as AJAX or others. Test a small area prior to use. You may also clean the surface with a product like Mr. Clean Magic Eraser. This product works quite well. Hose product off with clear water when done.
- 7) Product is sealed with a clear matte exterior UV resistant sealant. You may reseal it if needed after several years.
- 8) Place product in an area that is not susceptible to damage from lawn mowers, bicycles, etc. as they may chip the stone if struck.
